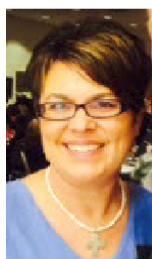

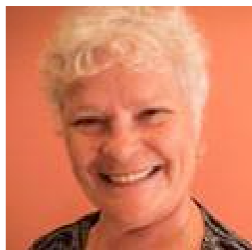

Administration of Medications to Children in Child Care *Facilities* provides a mechanism for administering medication to children in child care facilities. SESSION O: Asking Questions that Extend Children's Learning **with Addie Hester**

Asking meaningful questions has the power to turn on children's brains and to get them thinking in new ways. They will help increase vocabulary, support more complex language conversations, develop higher level thinking skills and extend the overall development and learning of children. Asking questions during daily teacher interactions with children is an art that takes time and practice to develop which benefits both the child and the teacher. This session will describe strategies to enhance the teacher practice of being more purposeful and intentional in asking children open-ended questions during daily teacher-child interactions. Asking open-ended questions can help teachers improve their interactions and maximize their results in the Instructional Support domain of CLASS
